


"Destin" ation Wedding Planning Checklist

The following checklist is designed with the (ideal) timetable of twelve months. If you're planning your wedding on a shorter schedule, just start at the beginning of the list and try to catch up as

9 TO 12 MONTHS BEFORE THE WEDDING DAY				
	Arrange a gathering for you and your parents.			
	Determine budget and how expenses will be shared.			
	Discuss the size, style, location, and scope of the wedding you want. Get inspired!			
	Choose a target wedding date and time. (The actual date will depend on venue availability.)			
	Create a binder to store and organize your ideas, worksheets, receipts, brochures, etc.			
	Hire a wedding planner to help you find your venue and wedding/reception services and make your wish list of services with her planning guide.			
	Start compiling your guest list to estimate head count. Consider budget when			
67	TO 9 MONTHS PRIOR			
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	Choose the members of your wedding party. Enroll in wedding/shower gift registries. Have a phone chat with your wedding planner to make updates to your wedding proposal. Retain services that you know you want to book. Book an engagement photo session, especially if you plan to include a professional engagement picture with Save-the-Date cards. Reserve a block of hotel rooms for out-of-town guests. (Ask about group rates.)

	Select and order wedding gown, leaving ample time for delivery and alterations.		Start planning your honeymoon.			
	Shop for bridesmaids' dresses.					
4 TO 6 MONTHS PRIOR						
	Finalize the guest list.		Plan the rehearsal dinner.			
	Order invitations (25 extra) and other wedding stationery (i.e., place cards and thank you notes).					
	Finalize all travel plans					
	Check in with your wedding planner. Start finalizing the details of your wedding/reception services.

	Write your rehearsal dinner toast.
